## The false science of Uniformitarianism

When evolutionists discuss topics related to evolution and billions of years, the false science of Uniformitarianism will be part of their thought process. Uniformitarianism is the idea that the rates of macro processes measured today are the same as they were in the past. This is the use of projection outside of measured and observed ranges. And in this case, it is linear projection outside of measured and observed ranges. But that is just pseudo-science. And it almost always fails in the real world, aka reality. Here are some examples of how this false science fails.

In physics, if a force is applied to a spring, it will stretch. The equation F = kx determines the relationship. But as the spring is stretched enough it breaks.

Charles Lyle used this same false science when calculating the age of Niagara Falls. The falls recedes at a certain rate per years and thus it must have started so many years ago based on that rate. But no one was there to monitor the rate for the past 1000s of years. The drainage of the waters from the flood would have moved it back much quicker in the years after the flood.

Mutations in the DNA cause changes to species. So, using projection this supposedly shows, that given enough time, a single cell creature evolved into all the life forms today. This has never been observed. The genetics of each species can be viewed as variation around a stable minimum in a N dimensional set of disconnected manifolds. It is impossible to move one species to change into another. Too many changes will destroy a creature.

Another instance of using this false science is in calculating the rate of buildup of sediment layers. Supposedly the layers build up at a certain rate per year. Supposedly this is how dead animals become fossilized and polystrate trees and fossils are buried. But when an animal dies it decays and is scavengered quickly. So, it must be buried quickly else there will be nothing left to fossilize. The same goes for polystrate trees and fossils.

Catastrophism is real science. The 1980 eruption of Mount Saint Helens is a perfect example of this. The aftermath of that eruption has been studied and has refuted almost all conjectures using the false science of Uniformitarianism. But as large as Mount Saint Helens was, it pales in comparison with the catastrophic effects of the worldwide flood.
